

LIST OF R.I. SENIOR CENTERS AND TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED

Peck Center for Adult Enrichment (Formerly Barrington Senior Center):

Barrington has 1 bus (seats 10). We provide transportation to and from the center daily for lunch and shopping at Shaw's and CVS on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Beechwood House, (North Kingston):

North Kingstown has two (2) busses. One – 16 passenger and one – 22 passenger.

Both have wheel chair lifts for 2 wheelchairs.

We provide free transportation for North Kingstown Seniors 55+ and Disabled to and from the Senior Center for meal site, activities, special evening meals. Transportation for grocery shopping from home on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Wal-Mart twice a month. Also transport choral group to nursing homes to perform twice per month.

Benjamin Church Center, Bristol Senior Center):

The Benjamin Church Senior Center has a 15 passenger with wheelchair lift. We provide transportation to and from the center daily for meal site lunch and for activities, doctors appt, hair appt, post office, library and grocery shopping on Tuesdays and Thursdays free of charge for the seniors. We also do mystery rides monthly.

Capital Cities Community Center:

Charlestown Senior Center:

The town does not provide any senior transportation. We rely on what the state offers and volunteer organizations.

Coventry Senior Center:

We do have one van available to Seniors. At this time, we have shopping run from one of our elderly housing units. I did put in for additional hours to provide seniors with additional assistance, however it was denied this budget season.

Cranston Enrichment Center:

Cranston Enrichment Center provides transportation to and from the center. We also provide other runs like doctors, shopping and really anything the senior will need like hairdresser as such. We charge \$25.00 month for that service which is unlimited but just to and from the center is free. We have 8 busses, 6 in service with 2 new ones expected delivery next week.

Cumberland Senior Center:

Cumberland has 2 vans. 1 full time driver. 1 fill in driver, she is also our clerk (she has a CDL) she drives when our full time driver is out or drives for trips ex. Lunch, playhouses, restaurants.

Our daily routine will bring senior to the center and shopping; we do not provide rides to doctors' appointments. We do provide rides from high -rises to the supermarket and the malls

Both are equipped with a wheel chair lift.

East Greenwich Senior Center:

We operate one van (20 passengers) with a wheelchair lift. We have one full time driver who works 35 hours per week. Bus fees are \$10 for a month or \$2 per trip. Monday through Thursday: Senior dining and activities at the Swift Community Center, East Greenwich Free Library, Doctor/Dentist (morning appointments in East Greenwich on Tues/Wed), Stop & Shop(Thursdays), Day trips and retail shopping (Fridays).

East Providence Senior Center:

East Providence provides within the city daily door-to-door service to and from the center.

Edward King House:

We have no transportation system at the Edward King House Senior Center outside of Logisticare, Uber, RIPTA and Go Go Grandparent.

Leon Mathieu Center (Pawtucket):

We operate two vans with wheelchair lifts and have two full time drivers who both work 35 hours per week.

One van is a 16 passenger (with ability to add 2 wheelchairs)

One van is a 14 passenger (with ability to add 2 wheelchairs)

Services are available Monday – Friday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Lincoln Senior Center:

We have one 18 passenger, with wheel chair lift, bus. We provide transportation to and from the center for meals and activities for senior and disabled Lincoln residents free of charge.

Middletown Senior Center:

Just to inform, Middletown Senior Center does not have a van at this time. However, it has been requested in our 2019 budget and it looks like it will be a successful line item.

If approved, it will be used for rides to and from the Center as well as a weekly trip to local shopping Centers. It will not be used for doctor appointments etc.

Narragansett Community Center:

The Town of Narragansett does provide transportation to Narragansett seniors for medicals, shopping. The driver is limited to the Narragansett/Wakefield area. The seniors must be self-sufficient and the hours are 8:00 until 11:30 am. The bus driver is a part time position.

Salvatore Mancini Center (North Providence Senior Center):

Pilgrim Senior Center (Warwick):

The Pilgrim Senior Enrichment Center provides the following for senior transportation:
The Transwick Program provides transportation to Warwick residents who are 55 years or older or are disabled and have no other means of transportation at their disposal.

Services include transportation to the Pilgrim Senior Center for classes, programs, lunch, social service appointments and special events. Transwick also provides weekly grocery shopping trips throughout the city. The program also provides personal appointment trips for hairdresser, bank and pharmacy. We do not provide transportation to doctor's appointments. Trips to the Warwick library, McDermott pool and YMCA are also arranged. Retail and dinner trips are scheduled quarterly. Trips to points of interest are also scheduled. These trips are on a sign up, first come-first serve basis and are priced accordingly.

Portsmouth Senior Center:

Portsmouth Senior Center does not provide transportation nor does the Town of Portsmouth for our seniors.

The Center (South Kingstown):

Our transportation is limited to South Kingstown residents age 60+ years.
We provide non-medical rides. Riders may purchase a \$10 pass at the Senior Center good for Twenty (20) - one way trips for any non-medical transportation.
Trips to the Senior Center are free of charge for seniors and disabled.

Tiverton Senior Center:

Tiverton Senior Center has a 16 passenger van and provides transportation on Tuesdays & Wednesdays to the center and/or to specific shopping centers. We do not provide individual appointments (ex. Doctors). We offer one "fun" trip a month on the second Friday of the month to a restaurant, event, etc.

Warren Senior Center:

The Warren Senior Center has one 16-passenger bus with a handicap lift. It services the seniors and younger disabled in the Town of Warren Monday through Friday for doctors appts., shopping, and to and from the Senior Center for activities and lunch.

West Warwick Senior Center:

The West Warwick Senior Center has two (2) busses. One-14 passenger / One-12 passenger with a wheel chair lift for 2.

We provide transportation for West Warwick Seniors and Disabled to and from the Senior Center for meal site/activities/monthly evening meal/bi-weekly shopping trips/special events.

Westerly Senior Center:

The Town of Westerly has a 14 passenger van (12 regular and 2 wheelchairs) that the Senior Center operates on its behalf (the Senior Center is NOT a Town agency). The van provides transportation to Westerly residents on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays for shopping, hairdressing, nursing home visits (basically anything not covered by the State Logisticare program – medicals and Meal sites). The van also provides monthly trips to the Crystal Mall in Connecticut and the Warwick Mall in Rhode Island alternately every two weeks.

Woonsocket Senior Services:

Senior Services, Inc. does not provide transportation at this time. However, if we ever get our bus up and running again, this may change as we may look to offer limited trips.

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
